

To the Parents of Campers Receiving Medications:

Some of the medications the 4-H Center supplies are: 325 mg Tylenol, 25 mg Benadryl, swimmer's ear drops, Tums, Benadryl gel, Calamine lotion, regular eye drops, liquid Benadryl, liquid Tylenol, Aloe Vera gel, and Solar-cane spray. The 4-H Center does **NOT** supply products containing ibuprofen, aspirin, sunscreen, or bug spray.

EVERYONE'S medications must be stored in first aid. Give any medications, prescription or over-the-counter, to the agent or adult leader that will be responsible for giving them to the nurse. All medications **MUST** be in their original containers or they will not be dispensed.

Campers are allowed to carry an epi-pen or inhaler with them if they prefer; however, we do encourage them to leave these in first aid.

The following are the times for campers' medications:

- Morning Medications: 7:00am – 8:00am
- Noon Medications: 11:30am – 12:30pm
- Afternoon Medications: 1:00pm – 4:00pm
- Evening Medications: 5:00pm – 6:00pm
- Bedtime Medications: 10:00pm – 11:00pm

The nurse leaves at 6:00pm. A trained 4-H professional will take over after 6:00 pm. Because bedtime is a very busy time to give medications, please have your child take as many of their medications before the nurse leaves.
